COVID-19 Vaccination Information

This information is based on the New York State Department of Health Guidance for Weeks 1-4 New York State Vaccination Program Phase 1A. COVID-19 vaccine must be given according to the prioritization plan established by the NYSDOH.

Beginning Week 4, January 4, 2021:

Home care workers and aides, hospice workers, personal care aides and consumer-directed personal care workers are prioritized to be vaccinated.

Vaccine Form

Prior to receiving the vaccination, you must complete the <u>New York State COVID-19 Vaccine</u> <u>Form</u>. This form can be completed <u>online</u> and you will receive a submission ID, or you can fill out the form at your vaccination site. The NYSDOH vaccine form includes a self-attestation, which must be completed prior to vaccination. Vaccination eligibility is based on current employment status.

Proof of Occupation

Individuals being vaccinated must bring proof of eligibility to the vaccination site. This may include the Unlimited Care Inc. photo identification card, the letter from Unlimited Care Inc. verifying your prioritization status or an Unlimited Care Inc. pay stub.

Vaccine Safety

Post-vaccination monitoring is an essential part of the COVID-19 vaccination program. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is promoting and encouraging all those being vaccinated to participate in V-Safe, a smartphone, based application that will allow those vaccinated to enter their symptoms in the days after vaccination using text messaging. V-Safe also provides reminders for the second dose and telephone follow up for anyone who reports medically significant adverse events.

V-Safe materials can be found at http://www.cdc.gov/vsafe, including a V-Safe information sheet. Please print out the information sheet and hand to each person vaccinated. You must report any adverse events that occur after vaccination to the Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System (VAERS) at info@VAERS.org or by calling 1-800-822-7967.

Vaccination Documentation

Unlimited Care will request proof of vaccination status. Employees must provide proof of vaccination to Unlimited Care, Inc. Proof can be in the form of a card issued by your local hospital, the CDC, DOH, a pharmacy, etc.

Vaccination locations

As of January 4, 2021, **eligible** New Yorkers can get the COVID-19 vaccine at sites located throughout the NYS. Hospitals, Urgent Care Centers, Federally Qualified Health Centers and Local Departments of Heath are administering COVID-19 vaccinations to home care workers. Locations will be provided by the Branch office.
